THE AIRTOURER ASSOCIATION IS 30!

Doug Stott

In 1977, Sydney based Bob Page and Harry Couzin were co-owners of a 115hp Airtourer and they had been having trouble sourcing parts from NZ where Airtourer production had moved in 1967 after the closure of Victa Aviation at Bankstown NSW. In his frustration Bob penned a letter to the AOPA Magazine in May 1977 seeking interest in the formation of an owners club to help give some strength with the NZ supplier for what at that time was over 100 Airtourers located in Australia.

Little did they know that there were many other Airtourer owners having similar frustrations and the response to their call for help was significant. One of the first to respond to the letter was Airtourer owner Doug Stott (your scribe) who at that time was modifying his Airtourer from a 100hp to a 160hp and was also having similar problems with the supply of parts from NZ. Bob penned a further letter to AOPA in August 1977 advising the formation of an Association and that Henry Millicer had agreed to be Patron.

Over the following months many phone calls and letters to all the registered owners in Australia saw the first meeting of the Association held at the RACNSW in late 1977 where an interim committee was elected pending a formal first meeting. Harry Couzin was elected interim President and Doug Stott Interim Secretary. The hard yards followed and the first official Airtourer Convention and General meeting was held at Griffith NSW on the Australia Day long weekend (as it was back then) in

January 1978.

The first Convention saw 23 Airtourers and a RAAF CT4A attend.

Airtourer designer Dr H.K. (Henry) Millicer was kindly flown there courtesy of Kendal Airlines and enjoyed many flights with keen owners where he demonstrated his flying ability showing infinite faith in his design. Henry was formally appointed Patron at that first Convention, a position he held with pride until his passing in 1996. A classic photo was taken of Henry in front of a fleet of Airtourers at that first Convention and later graced the cover of the AOPA magazine in 1978. Long time Airtourer owner and enthusiast Bill Miller from Geelong was one of many that drove to Griffith with a collection of fibreglass spares in his car. The CT4A (A19-047) from 1FTS RAAF Point Cook flown by Instructors Simon Ford and Ky Hansen made it to the first Convention. This was to form the beginning of a sound relationship with the RAAF and the flying school at Point Cook for so long as the RAAF operated the type.

At that first convention, long time Airtourer (VH-FMA) owner from West Wyalong, Sonny Rankin was elected President, Doug Stott (VH-CTM) from Essendon, Secretary and Bill Kelly (VH-TWE) from Banockburn, Treasurer. Latrobe Valley Aero Club instructor Alex Hood (now with the ATSB) came up with the logo design and some of the legal eagles that are in every group wrote an initial constitution. Sonny, a farmer with a property named Yar-

randale to the west of Wyalong, instigated an annual fly-in to his property six months removed from the Annual Convention and usually held around September each year. This fly-in known then as the Yarrandale Fly-In continued until his passing in 1998. In subsequent years it became the Presidents Fly-in and has traditionally been held where the President lived, initially at Parkes NSW when the late Tony Matthews (VH-EQA) was President. Subsequently Hugh Knox (VH-MWR) from Sydney became President and because of the difficulties of holding a fly-in type gathering in the Sydney basin, the Presidents Fly-In then moved to a location of the President's choice. This tradition has been continued with subsequent Presidents which have seen an increased variety of locations visited by the members of the Association.

Membership of the Association has consistently represented over 90% of the Australian owners and many from overseas, mainly NZ and the UK. The UK members in fact have their own section and get together whenever the weather permits! At last count the world wide fleet was in the vicinity of 110 to 120, which is often difficult to count as there always seem to be a few off the register for various reasons and there are always rebuilds in progress. Many Association members are those that learnt to fly in or have an affinity for the little two-seater from their training day.

2008 will see the 30th anniversary of the Airtourer Association and the Annual Convention will return to Griffith (where it has been held every ten years since 1978) in March.

These day's owner groups such as the Airtourer Association are commonly known as "breed groups" and include the

Bonanza Society, the Mooney Association, Cessna 182 Association, and many others. The value of 'strength in numbers' is not only a means of speaking with a single voice on matters such as parts and airworthiness and exchanging views of operating techniques, including aerobatics and formation flying, but also a social base for interaction and the making of friends with a common interest. In fact many long term members and their families have formed sound friendships that go well beyond a common interest in a little aeroplane. Such relationships help make the Association as strong as it is today. On many occasions, new owners have attended Association gatherings, often with a conservative outlook, wondering what they are getting involved in, only to find a group of enthusiastic owners and pilots, new friends and the creation of a desire to return again and again.

Since those first days in 1978, the Airtourer Association has grown in strength and the value of the aircraft has as a result being well and truly maintained.

The most significant part of the history of the Association was the formation of the Airtourer Cooperative Ltd, a cooperative society formed in NSW to negotiate the purchase back from then owners New Zealand Aerospace Industries (previously Aero Engine Services Ltd (AESL)). With this task in mind a small group lead by Airtourer prototype test pilot Randy Green with Andrew Ronald (VH-MRJ/LVW) and Doug Stott, visited Hamilton NZ in 1978 in order to progress the possibility of a sale of what was to be known as the "Airtourer Project". A price was negotiated and with the groups return to Australia funds were raised by share holding in the cooperative. With initially 38 members, sufficient funds

were in place to make the deal. A short time later a further team lead by Sonny Rankin and others visited Hamilton and packed the “project’ into containers for return to Sydney.

Without a doubt the long term stalwart of the Association has been Alan Wood (VH-MUL/POB), who many would know from Victa days where he held the position of Service Manager. Alan has owned an Airtourer for many years and has enthusiastically flown to many parts of the country. His long established small workshop at Hoxton Park could always be identified by an Airtourer or two parked outside awaiting a service. Alan with the help of other volunteer members of the Cooperative has maintained the Project and the supply of spare parts since around 1980. He designed and obtained approval for a long range fuel tank (which is nice

to have on those Airtourers with the large engines) and was responsible for installing about 20 or so tanks, which for Alan was not always an easy task. Now in his 80’s Alan and wife Merle still fly to Association events. With the approaching demise of Hoxton Park arrangements are now well in hand to move the Project elsewhere and again a number of enthusiastic members have stepped forward to assist.

Like most other “Breed Groups” the Airtourer Association is something special to its members and to those owners that treasure their little aeroplane, safe flying and the friends resulting from a common interest.
